## **Safe & Quiet Boating**



## **Key Messages**

- Safe, quiet boating makes our lake community enjoyable for all.
  - 2. The lakes are a shared space; showing respect for diverse activities on the water and the people on the shore is part of our Muskoka culture.
  - ➤ 3. We can all do something about the excessive speed, noise and wakes that degrade the lake environment we treasure and want to sustain for future generations.

# 2013 Boating Survey

- Surveyed 2291 boaters in Muskoka area
- Moon River well represented 81 responses = 4% of total
- Survey identified many concerns top items include:
  - Lack of respect by boaters for other boaters & those on docks/shore
  - Noisy boats
  - > Speeding too close to shore
  - > Wakeboard boats creating high waves too close to shore
  - Damage to boats, docks and shoreline from high waves
  - Abuse of alcohol
  - Police enforcement

#### THE MUSKOKA BOATER'S CODE

I love and respect Muskoka – the beautiful waters and shorelines are ours to share, enjoy and protect. We are privileged to travel by boat in such a special place and knowing this, I promise to do my best to boat safely and responsibly by following The Muskoka Boater's Code:

- I will be aware of and obey all laws and regulations governing operation of my boat on our lakes and rivers of Muskoka.
- I will give a safety briefing and offer appropriate life jackets or PFDs to those who travel with me in my boat.
- I will carry the safety equipment and gear necessary to operate my boat safety and within the law.
- 4. I will never operate my boat beyond the level of my boating skills.
- 5. I will not consume alcohol in my boat, or operate my boat while impaired.
- 5. I will operate my boat with caution and courtesy to others when leaving from or returning to a dock.
- 7. I will respect wake impact on shorelines, docks and structures by looking behind my boat in designated slow speed zones or when within 30 m of shore and set a speed that leaves a minimum wake.
- I will set a speed and heading that delivers safety and comfort to both my passengers and passengers in other boats.
- I will always steer well clear of other boats, swimmers and wildlife, even if I am the "stand on" boat with right-of-way on the water.
- I understand that boating is a shared experience and I will not create excessive noise nor will I operate my boat in a manner that could intrude on the personal space and peaceful enjoyment of others.
